On April 25th, the Supreme Court will hear oral arguments in *FEC v. Wisconsin Right to Life* and *McCain v. Wisconsin Right to Life*, two cases which deal with whether the "electioneering communications" restrictions imposed by the Bipartisan Campaign Reform Act of 2002 (BCRA) impermissibly limit the free speech rights of corporations and unions. Our panel will discuss the legal issues surrounding these cases in particular, as well as the broader question of what degree of campaign finance regulation should be permitted. The panelists represent a variety of perspectives, including those of non-profits, the campaign finance reform community and political bloggers.
