As an Assistant U.S. Attorney, she dealt with federal cases involving terrorism, wire and mail fraud, economic espionage, and export control violations, among many other matters. Prager received her J.D. from the Western New England College School of Law in 1982 and an undergraduate degree in political science from Yale University in 1978.

Aiello LeBeau counsels domestic and foreign companies on compliance and enforcement issues related to U.S. export control regulations and economic sanctions.
